# **Introduction to Umpiring Course**

Information for course organisers and participants
July 2016



## A. General Course Information

- 1. This new training course is for people with little or no umpiring experience who will be umpiring the 11-a-side game. People who are going to be umpiring In2Hockey should complete the <u>Developing In2Hockey Umpires</u> course Completion of the Introduction to Umpiring course will **not enable (or equip)** you to umpire League hockey. The minimum age requirement is 12 years old.
- 2. The course comprises 4 modules:

Module 1	Pre course online Rules test	
	Participants must complete this before attending the course.	
Module 2	What makes a good umpire?	
	Participants will acquire some basic knowledge of how to	
	communicate effectively; how, where and when to play effective advantage and where they should be positioned to be able to	
	make accurate decisions.	
Module 3	Practical umpiring	
	Participants will have the opportunity to practise umpiring,	
	turning the knowledge just acquired into skills.	
Module 4	Preparation and planning the next steps	
	Participants will appreciate what they need to prepare pre-match	
	and what they can expect post course	

- 3. The course costs £15 per participant.
- 4. The course is delivered by England Hockey accredited trainers and tutors.
- 5. Participants, who have completed the course, including the pre course <u>online Rules</u> <u>test</u>, will receive a Certificate of Attendance, **not** a qualification.
- 6. Participants will receive a course workbook and whistle.

### B. <u>Information for Course Organisers: Organising a Course</u>

1. Any club wishing to host an Introduction to Umpiring course **must** complete the Course Request Form and submit it by email to <a href="mailto:umpiring@englandhockey.co.uk">umpiring@englandhockey.co.uk</a>

- 2. The Course Request Form must be submitted no less than 6 weeks before the requested course date.
- 3. The minimum number of participants is 14. Clubs may therefore wish to liaise with other clubs in their area to attract the required number of participants.
- 4. The course lasts 3 hours and can therefore be delivered in an evening.
- 5. The host club **must** be able to provide a classroom facility **FREE OF CHARGE**. This **must** include a screen (or blank, white wall) to project PowerPoint slides and video clips onto and appropriately located power sockets for a laptop and data projector.
- 6. The host club **must** be able to provide a **third of a pitch FREE OF CHARGE** for a 120 minute period. Please see the table below for how the timings fit in with the rest of the course.

1	What makes a good umpire?	35 mins
2	Practical umpiring	120 mins
3	Preparation and planning the next steps	15 mins

7. Ideally, the host club will provide a minimum of 10 players for that 2 hour period to help make the practical activities work.

#### C. <u>Information for Course Organisers: England Hockey Responsibilities</u>

- 1. Upon receipt of the Course Request Form, England Hockey will:
  - a. Confirm the name and contact details of the tutor(s).
  - b. Advertise the course on the <u>Find a Course</u> section of the England Hockey website.
  - c. Inform you of the participant registration process.
  - d. Provide a single point of contact for any queries you may have.

## D. <u>Information for Course Participants</u>

- 1. Payment must be made at the time of booking online.
- 2. Registration/log in details **must** be that of the participant and not of the person paying (if different).
- 3. You will need to complete the online Rules Test prior to the course and take your certificate to the course to show the tutor.
- 4. The course contains practical pitch activity. Please bring a hockey stick, shin pads, appropriate training clothing and footwear appropriate for astro.
- 5. Having successfully completed the course, including the online Rules test, you will be issued with a Certificate of Attendance.
- 6. If you will be U18 on the day of the course, you must bring to the course a completed Parental Consent Form.
